In April of 2023, members of the SAC coalition met for 5 hours over two days to discuss the best options for the Public Safety Mental Health Mill Levy funds that are allocated annually. The members attending were the Mental Health Center, Riverstone Health, St. Vincent's Health Care, Montana Rescue Mission, Homefront, Downtown Business Association, Community Crisis Center, Alternatives and Rimrock Foundation.

Below you will find the recommendation that was agreed upon during that time with some minor modifications based on the available resources.
