Member Presentation(s):

Nick Vertz with National Weather Service (NWS)

- NWS is staffed 24/7/365 for weather coverage. Currently fully staffed on their operations side (meteorologists). Cory Mottice was the previous NWS-LEPC interface – he moved to a different position out of state. Nick Vertz and John are filling that position until a new person is hired.
- NWS oversees issuing all of the advisories, watches, and warnings for all types of weather.
 - The fire weather reports are likely their biggest project.
 - NWS can also generate spot weather reports for fires or search and rescue efforts. This provides the most current and upcoming weather conditions for a specific area to give responders a better situational awareness of weather conditions.
 - NWS has 1 deployable meteorologist to send into the field (especially used during large fires).
- Online data includes current and upcoming weather projections, climate details, and fire/winter conditions/severity.
- LEPC members are encouraged to join the NWS Slack Chat (NWSChat 2.0) for faster, more direct communications.
- DON'T FORGET! NWS loves hearing from the public Data makes them happy! Send them storm details, numbers, pictures (rainfall totals, hail, snow depths, etc). They are weather nerds – the more information they have, the happier they are!

• Crisis Communications

- Previous quarterly meeting on 9/5. Discussed making sure people are trained as PIOs, trained on what a PIO does, and know who their PIO is and how to reach them.
 - Members attending a PIO class in Great Falls at the end of October hosted by Cascade County DES.
- The new communications person from MSU-Billings will be involved in group moving forward.
- Organizations need to work on building out messaging and getting ahead of social media rumor mill.

• Exercise Design

- At the previous meeting, we discussed lessons learned from the Montana Fair 2023 and the Airshow 2023.
- Planning for large and/or recurring events is starting to increase.
- Billings Public Schools (School District 2) is starting to get involved in an effort to work on their family reunification plans.
- It was also mentioned that people attending the Montana Fair felt safer with the larger law enforcement presence.

Subcommittee Reports (cont.):

Grants

- BLM has funding for hazardous fuels reduction projects. Application period opens this Fall.
- Forest Service grant closes in October.
- Yellowstone County received \$16,000 from DNRC to support volunteer fire departments.

• Health & Medical Advisory Group (HMAG)

- Working on getting signatures for MOU.
- Continuing work on FEMA Community Guidelines.

Planning

- The previous meeting was a special meeting aimed at bringing stakeholders together to discuss and strategize solutions around trauma communications based on Mass Casualty Incidents (MCI).
 - Goal to determine the best process.
- Moving forward, hospitals will use lamResponding (IAR) app. Each hospital will have 2-3 people that will receive trauma notifications to let them know that something is going on (act as a "heads up").
 - Previously trauma patients had a habit of just showing up unannounced at the hospital ERs.
 - IAR is not real time. Users are alerted with details provided at the time of notification. CrewForce = real time event. IAR makes hospital users aware of an event. They then need to open CrewForce to see what is happening in real time.
 - The call card project at 911 is slated to make this more effective/specific.

• Training

- Change the Date LEPC Meeting Survey Results
 - 44 people participated names of respondents were collected to ensure that they are regularly attending members for well-rounded and informed results.
 - Best Day of the Week = WEDNESDAY (50%)
 - Best Time Period = EARLY AFTERNOON 1:00-3:00pm (41%)
 - Next Steps We need to talk to Scheel's about the current audio/visual (AV) setup in the conference room.
 - Scheel's is a good location with plenty of room space and parking. The LEPC is looking at partnering with Scheel's to update conference room AV.
 - Alternatively, KC has received approval to use the Yellowstone County BOCC Conference Room. This room is also set up for Community 7 TV recording.
 - KC is looking into free/comped parking in the attached parking garage (work in progress).
 - Meeting date change will be implemented JANUARY 2024.
- Hazardous Release Report
 - Nothing beyond the usual flaring and small spills.
 - A couple of fines were levied on older spills.

Other Business/Discussion:

- St. Vincent's Hospital (SVH) broke ground on their new replacement hospital.
 - North 27th Street will have a lane closure for utility work starting the week of 9/18.
 - The route to the Emergency Room will have prolonged closures due to construction work. Follow the signage.
 - SVH is asking for regular route user feedback in order to ease complications.
- RiverStone Health (Dillon), Yellowstone County DES (KC), and the Citizen Corp Council (CCC) are resurrecting the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT).
 - o They are currently gauging community interest from area organizations.
 - Currently in the very early stages for bringing CERT back to Yellowstone County.
 More details to come.
