Lockwood Pedestrian Safety District Advisory Board

Meeting Minutes recorded and submitted by Zachary Hassler, Advisory Board Secretary Feb. 1, 2023, 7pm

Attendance

Other guests: Elyse Monat (Active Transportation Planner, City County Planning), DJ Clark (consultant, Sanderson Stewart)

Board members not in attendance: Carlotta Hecker

Dangerfield called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. and began by seeking public comment. There were **no public comments** provided.

Ask motioned to approve January minutes. Smith seconded. Motion carried with unanimous voice vote.

Dangerfield opened discussion on the spring 2023 sidewalk construction project from IGA to baseball fields. Design engineer Interstate provided update via email regarding a ponding area of concern near the baseball field. Interstate met with Tim Miller of Yellowstone County and tentatively concluded the area would benefit from drainage improvements in the vicinity. Interstate has estimated increased costs of \$35-40k and proposed a budgetary 50/50 split from LPSD funds and normal county funds.

Clark presented the board with Sanderson Stewart's progress to date on the update of the LPSD plan. Clark said the plan could be completed within approximately 30 days after receiving board feedback on project and crossing priorities.

Board members discussed the survey results and other potential pedestrian projects and reached consensus on the following project priorities:

- 1. Piccolo from school to IGA
- 2. Old Hardin Rd., east of the future interchange improvements at Johnson Ln. to Dickey Rd.
- 3. Sunrise Ave../Johnson Ln. east-west pedestrian facilities
- 4. Johnson Ln. pedestrian improvements between Sunrise Ave. and future interchange improvements at Johnson Ln.
- 5. 87E Sidewalk Gap, near school on south side of 87E

Projects on the list may proceed ahead of higher prioritized projects based on individual project feasibility and/or constraints.

The sidewalk project from the baseball fields to the future interchange improvements at Johnson Ln. was removed from the plan priorities list since it's already planned to be the board's next project in 2024. The board further recommended crossing projects be absorbed generally as sidewalk/ped facilities are constructed.

Woods reported the TEDD has approached the county about investing in the TEDD. He added the TEDD may be losing board members and could be looking for replacements.


Monat distributed trail counts and led a short general discussion on grant applications for the approaching Transportation Alternatives grant administered by the MPO.

Dangerfield adjourned the meeting at 8:39 p.m.





