Resolution to Create Yellowstone County Rural Special Improvement District No. 872M

To Maintain Public Roads in Ingraham Subdivision

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections 7-12-2101 through 7-12-2113 of the Montana Code Annotated, a board of county commissioners has the authority to create a rural special improvement district to construct and maintain a public improvement. When all the owners of the land in the proposed district do not consent to the creation of the district, a board should pass a resolution of intent, set a public hearing, provide notice of the public hearing, receive protests, hold a public hearing, consider protests and pass a resolution that either creates or does not create the district. When all the owners of the land in the proposed district consent to the creation of a district, the board does not have to hold a public hearing. The board can create the district with a resolution without a hearing.

WHEREAS, the Yellowstone County Board of County Commissioners received a petition from Darrell Dyer to create a rural special improvement district to maintain the roads constructed and dedicated to the public in Ingraham Subdivision. Attached is a copy of the petition. As a condition of subdivision approval, the Board required it to construct and dedicate the roads to the public and create a district to maintain the roads. All the landowners in the subdivision have signed the petition and consented to the creation of the district (see Exhibit F). Because all have consented to the creation of the district, the Board does not have to hold a hearing to create the district. The Board only has to pass a resolution to create the district.



On December 8, 2021, Mark English, a Deputy Yellowstone County Attorney assigned to the Civil Division, reviewed a petition to create a rural special improvement district submitted by Darrell Dyer to maintain a portion of Sixth Street and Tenth Avenue in Laurel, Montana. Dyer aggregated several lots in Ingraham Subdivision. He needed access to the lots. He constructed portions of Sixth Street and Tenth Avenue for access to the lots. He would like the Board of County Commissioners to create a district to maintain those portions of the roads. The petition indicates what parcels will be included in the district, what roads the district will maintain, what maintenance will be provided to the roads, how much the maintenance provided to the roads will cost, how the cost to maintain the roads will be assessed and all the owners of the parcels to be included in the district consent to the creation of the district. The petition appears legally sufficient. Because all the owners of the parcels in the district have consented to the creation of the district, the Board does not have to hold a hearing to create the district.
