Member Presentation(s):

Bobby Westbrook with Par Montana Refinery

- There are 320 full-time employees at the refinery.
 - There are also approximately 80-100 contractors.
- Can process up to 63,000 barrels of crude oil/day.
 - Annually produces approximately:
 - 400 million barrels of gasoline
 - 300 million barrels of diesel
- Oil Spill Response Team
 - 16 Responders and HAZMAT Technicians
 - Swift water oil spill certified
- Rescue Squad
 - o 12 members are EMT, high angle, and confined space certified.
 - They have recently added industrial rescue (equipment/crush injuries)
- Mutual Aid Agreements with:
 - Billings Fire
 - Lockwood Fire
- Refinery conducts quarterly trainings and is hosting a large industrial rescue class in June 2024.
 - Will work with area partners and other refineries.
 - Dates to come later to observe and participate.
- Fire Brigade
 - o 40 members on the fire brigade

Member Presentation(s) continued:

Bobby Westbrook with Par Montana Refinery (continued)

- Drone Team (NEW)
 - 7 FAA certified drone pilots
 - Can deploy to get more data and reduce responder risk and can make response more efficient.
 - Also helps to keep key partners in the loop with more details/live feed.

Albert Mendoza with DHS-Cybersecurity & Infrastructure Security Agency (DHS-CISA)

- Albert Mendoza oversees the physical security assessments for the Eastern portion of Montana.
 - He travels all over Eastern Montana to carry out these assessments.
 - These assessments are FREE.
 - o Conducts reviews for both public and private partners.
- CISA is fairly new (only 5 years old) and has roughly 3,100 employees.
- Their goal is to foster partnerships with the government and private sector to better prepare local, state, and private sector entities.
- CISA covers/conducts reviews for critical infrastructure across all 16 sectors.
- These reviews help facilities better understand how a negative event can affect their facility and everybody else.
- Critical infrastructure is critical and plays a key role in everybody's daily lives.
- We [everybody] can no longer be 'This is Montana it will never happen here.' IT ALREADY IS HAPPENING HERE and it's only going to become more frequent.

Member Presentation(s) continued:

Albert Mendoza with DHS-CISA (continued)

- There are two types of assessments: Infrastructure Survey Tool (IST) and Security Assessment at First Entry (SAFE) tool.
 - Infrastructure Survey Tool (IST): A vulnerability survey tool that applies weighted scores to identify infrastructure vulnerabilities and trends across sectors. Survey questions fall under the following categories:
 - Physical Security
 - Security Force
 - Security Management
 - Information Sharing
 - Protective Measures
 - Dependencies
 - Security Assessment at First Entry (SAFE): A tool designed to assess the current security posture and identify options for facility owners and operators to mitigate relevant threats.
 - Ideal for smaller facilities such as:
 - Rural county fairgrounds
 - Houses of Worship with only weekend services/smaller membership
 - Small health clinics

Continuing Discussion/Old Business:

- It is important to remember that the <u>federal requirements are HAZMAT only</u>.
 - Though the YC LEPC does above and beyond (which is fine, but we cannot ignore/drop the HAZMAT requirement).

• Several small spills, flaring, etc.

- YC-DES:
 - DES partnered with CHS Refinery for their recent TTX to test the new TRG IAP Software and EverBridge mass notification system.
- YC-GIS:
 - Statewide GIS Conference at the Northern in Billings (4/15-4/18)
 - MAGIP.com
- Mayor Cole:
 - Several swatting calls have been coming into local dispatch which involve Billings Police.
 - These are AI generated calls and can also be used to divert resources for a false incident call (refinery fire, train derailment, etc.).
 - These calls sound like a real person. They respond to questions and have an address.
 - Per Albert Mendoza with DHS-CISA:
 - These types of calls have been happening more frequently and it is a real issue.
